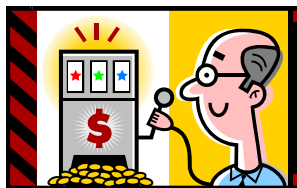

The above ground framing has commenced in the last sections located at the South side of the project. The final slabs for the Main Building were poured in late July and the Cottages are scheduled to begin after the first of the year. As the wood framing pushes forward, the electrical wiring, plumbing piping, and HVAC system ductwork follow quickly behind them. The first two levels of the 70' tower framing has been completed with only two more floors to go. As reported last time, the plastering of the exterior of the building began in September, starting on the North section of the building and working along the West edge of the structure. The webcam has been repositioned highlighting the construction of the pool area and the framing of the South side sections.
